Subject: Recommendation for new facility to be developed on the school site

Dear Mrs Lim,

Firstly, I believe that the Performance Arts Centre is a better choice than the Science and Technology Building and Fitness Centre for the following reasons. We already have science labs and computer labs in our school, and while they may not be equipped with the latest equipment and technology, I feel that they are sufficient to support us in our learning. Similarly, we already have a track and field as well as indoor sports hall in our school, which gives students more than enough locations to hold various sports activities. Although we may not have state-of-the-art gym facilities or a swimming pool in our school, I believe that public gyms and public pools are also easily accessible outside of school. Hence, this is why I feel that the Performance Arts Centre would be the option that adds the most value to our school.

Personally, I am interested in the arts and am also in a Performing Arts Co-curricular Activity (CCA). Presently, Performing Arts CCAs in the school face the challenge of securing a performance venue whenever we want to hold a performance. Additionally, space constraint is also a challenge for our weekly CCA practices in school, especially when different CCA groups have practice on the same days. With a new Performance Arts Centre, we would have a suitable venue for performance as well as studios and practice rooms to solve all these problems.

Building the Performance Arts Centre will also benefit not only the Performing Arts CCAs but the whole school in general as well, as it includes many facilities. The studios and practice rooms can also be used by teachers to hold classes during school hours, and the performance venue can be used to hold assembly programmes. The foyer will have an exhibition area which can be used to showcase the artwork of students, as well as to hold school events such as our science fairs. The café also offers students a more conducive environment to meet up for project meetings or to study after school. All these will allow our students to have a more vibrant and exciting time learning in school.

By giving our students a more holistic learning environment centered on the Performance Arts Centre, it is something that would be appealing to parents as well. Parents will also be less worried and more assured, knowing that their children are participating in activities in the Performance Arts Centre in school, rather than loitering around outside the school after school hours. Having a vibrant school culture will also help to convince parents of potential students to make the decision to send their children to our school.
